headspace is the National Youth Mental Health Foundation providing early intervention mental health services to 12-25 year olds, along with assistance in promoting young peoples' wellbeing. These centres are located across the north and west of Melbourne and managed under Orygen, The National Centre for Excellence in Youth Mental Health. These centres have unique clinical governance with a Clinical Director providing access to psychiatric secondary consultation, assessment and support. Within all centres there is a vibrant, multidisciplinary youth health workforce.

About the Role

We aim to provide young people with holistic primary health care and engagement with early intervention for those at risk of mental health issues. **headspace** centres provide medical staff with full practice support, including reception, billing and other administrative support. Doctors work on sessional rates retaining a very high percentage of their Medicare billings.

- · Work collaboratively in a multidisciplinary setting
- Develop confidence and increased skills in working with young people

- Access to professional development opportunities and training in youth mental health and the headspace model of care as well as learning opportunities through National e-learning
