Social prescribing enables GPs to refer patients whose health is being affected by non-medical factors, such as housing, financial stress, health literacy or social exclusion, to a range of community services that can help address these concerns. NWMPHN is funding IPC Health, in collaboration with Victoria University and Brimbank City Council, to develop and test the model. A Community Link worker will be placed into the IPC Health Deer Park centre to better connect GPs and patients with local non-clinical services.

NDIS October rollout

The National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS) is a no-fault insurance scheme, which is the new way of providing individualised support for people with permanent and significant disability, their families and carers. The scheme is designed to empower people with disability who meet the eligibility criteria in making choices about the supports they need based on a plan that includes support needs, goals
