### Community Support Service

FLN offers individualised support and referral services to Refugees, Asylum Seekers and New Migrants. We focus on building the knowledge and skills necessary for individuals and families to achieve independence and settle in Australia.

#### We provide:

- Information and referrals regarding housing matters, citizenship, family violence, health, community groups and employment pathways
- Support understanding and completing Visa, Citizenship and Immigration forms
- Advocacy
- Legal information sessions
- English tutoring

- Access to weekly fruit and vegetables
