# Strengthening Care for Children (SC4C) 6-month Celebration and Feedback



### What is happening?

To celebrate 6-months of the SC4C project in your practice, the study team would like to invite you to a catered breakfast or lunch.

We would also like to use this opportunity to **strengthen our understanding of barriers and enablers that have been encountered during the SC4C project** to inform further adaption of the model and future scalability. To achieve this, we will be **conducting a short focus group** (30-40 minutes maximum) with participants attending the catered celebration.

### What will I be asked about during the focus group?

In this focus group, we invite you to discuss:

- The challenges you have faced implementing SC4C in your practice;
- What is needed to make the SC4C model successful in your practice; and
- The use of telehealth compared to face-to-face co-consults and online versus in-person case discussions.

The focus group will be conducted by Dr Michael Hodgins with support from SC4C team members. Written consent of your participation will be obtained on the day.

### Why should GPs and practice staff participate?

There may be no direct benefits for you to take part in a focus group or interview, however you will have the **opportunity to provide useful feedback** for assessing and further improving the implementation of the SC4C model.

## What if I have more to say after the focus group?

We also invite interested participants to discuss their experience in more detail during a one-on-one telephone or zoom interview. You can also provide feedback through an online survey on an ongoing basis.

#### Will what I say remain anonymous?

All focus group and interviews will be de-identified for analysis, ensuring no personally identifying information is presented in research findings and publications. If you find it difficult to discuss aspects of SC4C in front of colleagues present, we offer the opportunity for a private one-on-one interview at a later date.
