Priority Primary Care Centre

For urgent, non-emergency care

Victoria's Priority Primary Care Centres provide free urgent treatment for conditions like mild infections and burns, suspected fractures or broken bones.

They are for when you need urgent attention, but not an emergency response – when you can't see your GP but you don't need to go to the emergency department.



They help Victorians who need urgent care to see a doctor quickly, while keeping our busy emergency departments free for those in critical, life-threatening situations.

Priority Primary Care Centre services are free for everyone, with or without a Medicare card.

They operate seven days a week, up to 16 hours a day.

There are 27 Priority Primary Care Centres open around the state
